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Issue:

Residential Transportation Rates

- Customers that acquire their own natural gas and make arrangements to deliver that gas to the local utility system pay a transportation rate for using the utility system. The customer, not the utility, pays for the gas itself.
- Traditionally, utilities have offered transportation rates to large commercial and industrial consumers, however, not many offered the same service to smaller residential customers.
- Today, many residential customers now can access these programs, but only a small fraction choose to do so. Therefore not all states can report prices.
- Recently, the cost per Mcf for this utility transportation service has averaged more than \$4.00.
