Purpose	To review and revise GM to address changes from Amdt 192-130 (RMV Valve Rule), 131 (192.8 - Petition for Reconsideration), 132 (Transmission Repair Criteria), 132 (Transmission Repair Improvements & Related Amendments), 133 (Transmission Repair Technical Corrections), and 134 (RMV Valve Rule Technical Corrections).
Origin/Rationale	There have been a number of additional amendments to code since the gathering line regulations became effective. While many of the TR's that resulted from these amendments addressed gathering lines, this TR is to ensure that gathering line requirements were correctly identified.

Section 192.8

1 DEFINITION ...

2 TYPE OF GATHERING LINE

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2.3 Type C gathering line.

- (a) A Type C gathering line has an outer diameter equal to or greater than 8.625 inches and is located in a Class 1 location to which either of the following conditions apply.
 - (1) A non-metallic line (e.g., plastic, composite pipe) where the MAOP is greater than 125 psig.
 - (2) A steel line where the MAOP is equal to or greater than 20% SMYS.
 - (3) A steel line with an unknown stress level and the MAOP is greater than 125 psig.
- (b) Type C gathering lines are subject to the requirements of §192.9(e).
- (c) An alternative method to determine the MAOP of a Type C gathering line is provided in §192.8(c)(4). Operators of Type C gathering lines with an outside diameter greater than 12.75 inches must comply with §192.9(e)(2)(ii) to establish MAOP for use outside of segment identification, unless the exceptions are met in §192.9(f).

Section 192.465

Note: Operators of Type A, Type B, and Type C gathering lines are exempt from following the extra steps for monitoring and remediation of external corrosion found in the requirements of §192.465(d) and §192.465(f) (see §192.9(c), (d) and (e)). Operators of these lines should consider the remediation guidance, and might consider the benefits of developing a remedial action plan with associated deadlines and investigating non-systemic or systemic causes of inadequate cathodic protection.

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Section 192.473

This guide material is under review following Amendment 192-132. [see TR 22-59]

Note: Operators of Part 192 regulated gathering lines are specifically exempted from §192.473(c) in §192.9(c), (d), and (e). They are not required to conduct an interference survey, analyze the results, or create remedial action plans for additional external corrosion controls; however, they might consider the benefits of these additional controls.

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Section 192.485

Note: Operators of Part 192 regulated gathering lines are specifically exempted from following §192.485(c) in §192.9(c), (d), and (e), but might consider the benefits of calculating the remaining strength of pipe based on the actual remaining wall thickness.
